

# STEWARDING GOD'S PROVISION



# A Process Provided by YOU

Our step-by-step process helps women navigate their options with clarity and support, offering personalized care that prioritizes both their physical and emotional well-being. From the moment they reach out for help, compassionate staff members and volunteers walk with them through each stage, ensuring they have access to the information and resources they need to make informed decisions.



## 2449 TOTAL VISITS

In 2024, we recorded a total of 2,449 client visits. This figure encompasses the full spectrum of services we provide, including medical appointments, emergency baby supplies, and mentorship sessions.

## 559 PREGNANCY TESTS

Our volunteers and patient care team receive each woman we serve with open arms in her moment of need. You provide compassion, hope, help, and truth to each woman we serve for as many appointments as she needs.



## 715 ULTRASOUNDS

Studies show that 85% of women considering abortion will choose life for their unborn child after seeing an ultrasound. This remarkable statistic highlights how this medical tool is truly a lifesaving resource.

## 767 EMERGENCY SUPPLIES

The term "emergency supplies" at WRC encompasses the 767 requests we received from individuals seeking assistance through various means, such as walking in, calling, or texting during challenging times. In response, we were able to distribute a considerable quantity of baby clothes, essential supplies, and baby food to those in need.



## 81 STI TESTS ADMINSTERED

STI testing and treatments allow us to discuss abstinence and the concept of sexuality as designed by God. The STI services were launched in 2022.

## 71 WOMEN CHOSE LIFE

The results of the services you provide to women in need are LIVES SAVED! A life that was almost lost is rescued because you gave a woman services and care that were essential in the decision-making process.



# Update from WRC Nurse Manager

Since having this position, I have talked to many women considering their options, with abortion often at the top of their list. Today, I counseled a woman undecided about her pregnancy. She came for a second ultrasound to confirm the viability of her pregnancy as the first ultrasound, two weeks earlier, did not show a baby. At her first appointment, she mentioned considering her options for several reasons: paternity, financial concerns, and health issues. These are common reasons I hear from women contemplating abortion.



She was a single mom, on and off with her current boyfriend, but had been with another man. Her previous pregnancy was high-risk, and she was worried about complications. During the ultrasound, I saw a tiny 5-millimeter baby with a strong heart rate. The patient was surprised but pleased to hear the heartbeat, as it was louder than any counseling words I could offer. Afterward, I asked about her thoughts and feelings. She expressed gratitude for our center's support in helping her decide and showing her the baby. She was shocked by the typical costs at abortion clinics and appreciated our free services. She planned to call an OB for an appointment and accepted my referral to a local community paramedic program for high-risk pregnancies.

I suggested our program to help with baby supplies. We also discussed paternity and conception dates. Her post-ultrasound counseling went well, with good discussions, and all her questions answered. **She chose life!**

I offered another ultrasound in a few weeks for further support. I am deeply grateful for this ministry—God's ministry. It means a lot that Women's Resource Center provides high-quality medical services for free, focusing on her well-being rather than profit. Your care and commitment to human life truly shines through the life-saving work being done here at WRC.


## From Heartbeat to Hope: Meet "T"!

T came to us when she was 16 weeks pregnant, facing immense pressure from the baby's father to have an abortion. Yet, the moment she heard that tiny, rapid heartbeat, she realized she couldn't go through with it. Without family support and feeling absolutely alone, T turned to WRC for help. She was determined to become the mother she had never had.

Joining our Encouraging Moms Club, T showed remarkable dedication. She attended every appointment and group meeting, eager to learn and grow. Together, we worked on budgeting and helped her sell an unmanageable home for a safer environment for herself and her unborn baby. During tough days and challenging decisions, we stood by her side, providing emotional support and practical resources to help her on her journey to motherhood.

T often asked, "Who does this?" I explained how WRC does not receive government funding due to restrictions on what we can say. Instead, amazing supporters, who love Jesus, babies, moms, and wish to see them succeed, make all of this possible. This was a new concept for T; her past experiences suggested otherwise. But thanks to our community's generosity, we showed T that kindness and support exist. She left our doors, knowing a better way existed, filled with hope and a newfound belief in herself as a mother.



### Embracing Change, Nurturing Hope

Through a Google search, Vi came to our mobile unit for medical services at the Veedersburg location. As soon as she entered the door, Casey & I could see by her demeanor that she was upset, scared, & nervous. She had taken several pregnancy tests at home, so she knew what her test result was going to reveal. She & her boyfriend had already discussed their options. Life changes such as activity limitations, an increase in expenses, & changes to her personal self were all on the line. Her boyfriend said he would support her choice whichever direction it led. Vi wasn't sure she wanted her life to change. Casey spent extra time talking to her about the fact that, yes, her life would change; but this change would be good. Through tears, Vi agreed with Casey that she didn't need to make a final decision that day & would come back for an ultrasound in a couple of weeks. A week before her ultrasound appointment, Vi called Casey with a concern of her baby being harmed due to what she was required to do at work. Casey reassured Vi that her baby would be ok but to contact her doctor. Before the conversation ended, Casey asked her how she was feeling about expecting. Vi emphatically stated she was feeling so much better & was going to parent her baby!

When Vi came for her first ultrasound, she was much more relaxed, & even a slight smile lit up her face when she talked about her baby. She shared with us that her boyfriend was now excited about being a dad. When she came back a couple of weeks later, she told us that he was already buying gifts for their baby. Our day was made!

Vi continued to come for regular appointments. During those visits, we spent time talking about all things, such as her nervousness about labor & delivery, to which we admonished her to not Google & to trust her medical team. We even heard her joke about how much weight she had gained, which was one of her concerns about carrying her baby. Her excitement when she would receive something for her baby was like a child at Christmas. She had fully embraced this new life. The unsure & confused girl we had met weeks before was gone, so much that her countenance from her file picture on the first visit looked nothing like she did now. In conversations with her, Vi assured us that she knew it was God's will for her to come that first day; & if she had not, the outcome of this pregnancy would have been different. How blessed we were to witness it all!
